What is Spiritual Direction?

Spiritual direction is a confidential ministry of compassionate accompaniment and guidance in the spiritual life. The spiritual director "directs" your attention to how God is moving in your



life, how He is gifting you, and how you are responding to His call.

Spiritual direction helps you to be led by the Spirit and avoid pitfalls, as you experience ongoing and deepening conversion, moving gradually toward the

summit of Love -- "the full stature of Christ" (Eph 4:13).

It is love alone that counts.

Is Spiritual Direction for you?

Benedict XVI recommended spiritual direction to all who wish to live their Baptism -- "new life in Christ" -- responsibly. If you desire a deepening of your relationship with God, consider exploring the possibilities through spiritual direction.

> Let your religion be less of a theory and more of a love affair. - G.K. Chesterton

How does it differ from counseling?

Although relationships and struggles are often discussed in spiritual direction, the emphasis is not on problem-solving, but rather, on discovering how God is moving in the midst of these very situations, and in the whole of your life.

How frequent are the meetings?

Typically, people meet for spiritual direction monthly, for an hour. Some choose to meet more frequently, especially at first. The frequency of sessions is your choice.

What happens in a session?

Through prayerful conversation, the spiritual director helps you to deepen your awareness of God's presence and action in your life -- and to respond with greater freedom, attentiveness, and commitment to His love and mercy.

Over time, the spiritual director helps you to navigate this journey in a number of ways, offering suggestions for spiritual reading, methods of prayer, and spiritual practices, as well as praying for you between sessions.

The process of spiritual direction gradually unfolds under the continual promptings of the Holy Spirit, who is, ultimately, the Spiritual Director. True joy is a victory, something which cannot be obtained without a long and difficult struggle. Christ holds the secret of this victory.

What are the potential benefits?

- Growth in intimacy with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit;
- Greater freedom and authenticity;
- Deepening of your prayer life as a way of being, not just something you do;
- Clarity in discernment;
- Balance among competing priorities;
- Integration of the mysteries of Christ in daily life;
- Deeper fidelity to your vocation;
- Abundant joy in God's Will.

Is there a fee?

Because spiritual direction is a ministry of prayer, spiritual directors do not charge a fee. But many do accept donations to support the ministry. Donations typically range from \$50 - \$100, but a donation of any amount is gratefully accepted.
